October 14, 2025

Council Chair Mike Milburn brought the Council Meeting to order at 3:00 p.m. Mountain Time. Council Members Jeff Allen, KC Golden, Doug Grob, Margaret Hoffmann, and Ed Schriever were in attendance in person. Thomas L. (Les) Purce and Charles F. Sams III attended virtually. The next Council meeting is scheduled for November 18 & 19 in Portland, Oregon and via webinar.

Council Meeting Agenda Items

1. Council Work Session: Power Plan Development

a. Power Plan Update

Director of Power Planning Jennifer Light provided updates on the Power Plan timeline, the new resource and transmission risk scenario, and the scenario modeling phase.

b. Needs assessment for changing hydro operations scenario

Director of Power Planning Jennifer Light, Power System Analyst Dor Hirsh Bar Gai, and Manager of Planning and Analysis John Ollis shared the results from the needs assessment analysis conducted for the changing hydro operations scenario. Staff provided a walk-through of the modeled hydro operations in the system and how they are similar or different across the four sensitivities. Staff also discussed system needs as identified in this needs assessment analysis and differences between the four sensitivities. Key takeaways include that the model showed significant needs for 2031; challenges are present across all seasons but particularly in winter; and that needs change across different hydro conditions, but the impact of hydro operations is small relative to overall needs driven by loads.

October 15, 2025

Council Chair Mike Milburn brought the Council Meeting to order at 10:32 a.m. Mountain Time. Council Members Jeff Allen, KC Golden, Doug Grob, Margaret Hoffmann, and Ed Schriever were in attendance in person. Thomas L. (Les) Purce and Charles F. Sams III attended virtually.

Report from the Executive Director and State Updates

Executive Director Peter Cogswell welcomed former Council Member Jim Yost to the meeting audience, reviewed the Council meeting agenda items, recognized several members and staff for their participation in recent regional public events, and provided an update on logistics for the 2026 Council meetings locations.

Member Grob shared his experience attending the Montana Electrical Co-op Association event with Chair Milburn. Member Golden discussed the value of hydro operations, while Member Hoffmann highlighted power projects that are creating economic opportunities for communities across the region. Member Sams spoke to the benefits of the Council's renewed engagement in regional events. Member Purce expressed appreciation for staff efforts in preparing materials for the Council's work sessions, and Member Schriever followed with remarks underscoring the value of the staff's contributions to the Council's work.

2. Independent Scientific Review Panel (ISRP) presentation: Review of the Lower Snake River Compensation Plan Steelhead Program, 2024-2025

Project Review and Implementation Manager Mark Fritsch and Independent Science Manager Erik Merrill presented a brief overview and history of the Lower Snake River Compensation Plan (LSRCP), including operations and maintenance funding and the review process. Fritsch introduced Richard Carmichael, Independent Scientific Review Panel (ISRP) Vice Chair who shared the ISRP's review of the LSRCP Steelhead Program and described the challenges, areas of high and low performance, and recommendations to improve performance, recognizing that many of the challenges limiting program success cannot be addressed by LSRCP Program actions alone.

3. Update on the on-going response to the quagga mussel infestation on the mid-Snake River, Idaho

Fish and Wildlife Policy Advisor Windy Schoby from the Idaho Council office introduced Chanel Tewalt, Director at Idaho State Department of Agriculture who provided an update on the efficacy of the previous chelated copper treatments for quagga and zebra mussels infestations and the commitment to the on-going response.

Regional Technical Forum (RTF) Manager Laura Thomas presented on the proposed RTF work plan for 2026. The work plan and budget reflect a scope of work and level of effort that was agreed to by all funders and supported through the five-year funding agreements for 2025 through 2029.

Matlock and Stover addressed the Northwest's emerging capacity and energy shortfalls and potential impacts to PNGC's member utilities.
