BACKGROUND:

Presenters: Lynn Palensky and Mark Fritsch

Summary: Briefly describe status of past reviews and early recommendations for moving forward with next sets of reviews. On the last page is a quick reference table showing the current status of funding recommendations from previous reviews. No action is necessary but staff would appreciate further guidance from the Committee.

Background:

Project review has taken many forms in the past, all responsive to policy considerations at the time of the reviews. At the Regional Coordination Forum's May 2017 meeting, the group shared impressions and conclusions from the past eight years of program implementation including the Accords and financial crises. Specifically, the group discussed strengths and issues concerning long-term funding commitments, programmatic approach to project implementation, portfolio management, and flexibility and financial disparities between Accord parties and non-accord parties. These topics will be considered in developing the Council's next project review process. Given what we've learned from past reviews, thoughts from regional partners, and outside influences to our program,

Steve Crow Executive Director we've outlined a basic set of goals, objectives and assumptions as we move into the next set of reviews:

Assumptions:

- Highly likely that there will be no new program money
- ISRP continues to review every project
- Research projects will have clearly defined end dates
- Budget Oversight Group will continue for project emergencies
- Continue to have a cost savings mechanism in place to identify and track funds from close-outs, unspent funds, etc

Goals:

- Build from existing body of proposed, reviewed and recommended work
- Build upon subbasin plans
- Build in budget flexibility for new work (innovative, emerging priorities, and under-funded areas of the program)
- Build in flexibility for strategic changes in scope (geographic or work elements) based on
 - o adaptive management
 - o best available science
- Provide certainty for multi-year projects
- Build on past reviews
 - o programmatic issues
 - o best available science from follow up science policy forums
- Support long-term commitments and investments (those with a long-term O&M component)
 - o Hatcheries (and associated habitat)
 - o screens and in-stream diversion structures
 - Wildlife lands and purchased fish habitat

Objectives

- Continue comprehensive approach in different program areas (e.g. Estuary, lamprey, sturgeon, wildlife)
- "Front-load" the reviews with science policy forum which will include recommendations for future direction/priorities.
- Build in budget flexibility for new work (innovative, emerging priorities, and under-funded areas of the program)
- Develop schedule for sequenced review for all program areas

Next Steps:

Complete the Wildlife Project Review and develop the process and schedule for conducting upcoming reviews or RM&E projects in the late 2017/early 2018.
