# State of Washington Salmon Recovery Planning

- State of Washington <u>ESA Response</u>: Extinction is not an Option = 1998 Legislature and Governor
- ESHB 2496 enacted in 1998 as the framework for developing habitat restoration projects Lead Entity Process (Strategies)
- Salmon Recovery Funding Act in 1999 delivers funds for projects via the SRFB
- Snake River Recovery Board self initiated in 2002 with funds from SRFB; Recovery Plan due June 2005



# Regional Recovery Planning L2 Coordinating Group

- Regional recovery plans are the vehicle for statewide salmon recovery
- Regional plans build on subbasin and watershed planning, synthesizing information across the ESU scale
- Subbasin and watershed planning is critical for identifying habitat actions at the watershed level
- Recovery planning: larger geographic scale with state and local commitments for implementation

#### **Science**

- NOAA TRT Viable Salmon Population parameters
- Regional Technical Team works with the NOAA TRT to provide local knowledge and data to ensure validity of products
- Actions necessary across the Region to meet population viability
   scenario building contrasting strategies at regional level –
   spans multiple watersheds/subbasins




### Challenges

- ESU doesn't align with political boundaries; 2 provinces in Region
- Assurance from NOAA and the State
- Participant <u>patience</u> and <u>endurance</u>;
   this is a 20 to 50 year effort
- Risk equity and engaging comanagers/federal processes

#### Recovery Planning....

- Is an investment plan for the Region's future, i.e., certainty and assurance
- Addresses local government authorities -- unlike other stakeholder led planning efforts
- Provides political, funding and regulatory incentives -- a distinct implementation advantage over other states
- Develops single prioritized project list at the regional scale for funding by BPA, SRFB, NFWF, and others based on science
   -- with the commitments to implement actions
