Subject: Update on the Council's Fish and Wildlife Division Work Plan

The Fish and Wildlife Division met yesterday to review the status of our work towards objectives for 2005. I'll brief you on some significant issues that we will work on in the remainder of the year at the August Committee meeting. I'd appreciate your response on the general direction of our work.

We use a summary of objectives and milestones to track our work. I am still making revisions based on yesterday's meeting for reporting to you and posting on the Council website. The current milestones are also helpful for coordinating with Bonneville, NOAA's ESA recovery planning and with the regional fish and wildlife managers. Major issues include:

- The work to propose a provincial objectives amendment process is on track. We need to develop an outreach plan to collaborate with interested parties on the possible scope and function of the amendments. The Council must still decide to open the Program for provincial objective amendments and that decision this fall.
- We are completing the basic outlines of the 2007-2009 project selection process for continued discussion with the Council and regional parties. The selection process incorporates much of the Council's staff work of the last two years in integrated monitoring and evaluation, hatchery reform, a research plan, and, of course, implementing subbasin plans.

Some specific assignments to call to your attention include:

• When the Council confirms the scope and process of the next project selection process, staff work on a regionally integrated monitoring and evaluation framework will intensify. This will draw on the collaborative work we participated in PNAMP but will require

We will have to work hard at collaboration because a fully integrated effort requires sharing effort with other programs and funding sources such as the Forest Service and the Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Fund.

- We are working with the federal action agencies and other participants to continue our efforts to implement the Mainstern Amendment's call for an improved regional executive forum for mainstem operations and construction decisions. Last year there was resistance from participants in the current forums, but there is some new support to improve participation and long range planning in response to the Council's measure. This has been stalled somewhat during the Bi-Op remand and ensuing litigation.
- We need to work with NMFS and regional managers to define the next steps for hatchery reform, using the products of the Artificial Production Review and Evaluation. NMFS' release of its hatchery policy and recovery planning inform prioritization and we expect the results of the analysis of hatchery objectives with subbasin plan objectives will also help.
