SUBJECT: Federal Agency Appropriations Requests for Fiscal Year 2007

I will present a brief overview of the Fiscal Year 2007 appropriations requests of the federal agencies that implement programs and projects in the Columbia River Basin pertaining to fish and wildlife. The agencies relying on annual appropriations that are of most interest to the Council are the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Bureau of Reclamation, NOAA Fisheries and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The tables below provide both the appropriations requests and enacted levels for the current year (FY 2006), as well as the requests for Fiscal Year 2007. The projects included in the tables are the ones the Council has considered to be priorities in recent years.

The most significant change for Fiscal Year 2007 is that the Corps of Engineers is proposing to move the Columbia River Fish Mitigation, Chief Joseph Gas Abatement and Willamette River Temperature Control projects from the *Construction, General* appropriations account to *Operations and Maintenance*. This is a development the Council may want to address in its annual funding recommendations to the Northwest congressional delegation.

The first table, which provides a basin wide summary of funding, was compiled by the Administration and was not accompanied by additional explanatory information. Therefore, the totals for the individual agencies do not necessarily match the totals in the other agency tables that I have compiled.
