Briefing on draft Fish and Wildlife Division Work Plan for 2007 **Subject:**

PURPOSE

This agenda item is for Committee and Council discussion of the objectives and sequence of work proposed by the Fish and Wildlife Division in 2007. The draft work plan is attached.

DISCUSSION

A major focus of the division's work will be preparing for opening the Fish and Wildlife Program for amendment in late 2007 or early 2008. The Fish and Wildlife Committee discussed this general schedule at its December meeting. Several tasks leading to calling for amendments include:

- Organizing a "Science-Policy" conference for high level discussions about major scientific issues in the Program and how those issues affect management decisions.
- Conducting additional staff-led evaluations of Program strategies during 2007.
- Developing conceptual provincial biological objectives to be proposed as Program amendments.
- Regional outreach and development of the amendment process itself.

With the Council's funding decisions for 2007-2009 complete, the staff will be working on proposing the scope and schedule for the next round of project selection decisions. The staff also have many follow-up tasks from the last decisions; both individual project issues and programmatic issues such as the operations and maintenance costs of the Program.

The work plan also includes schedules for continuing work on Mainstem Amendment implementation, supporting independent scientific review of the program, improving monitoring
