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Focus of Evaluation

Market development & river restoration

- 1. Experiment with open market transactions in water rights
- 2. Increase water in flow-limited reaches of Columbia Basin
- 3. Restore habitat for anadromous and resident fish

Attributes of program model

- 1. Sustainability and scalability in Columbia Basin
- 2. Broader applicability of CBWTP model



Main Findings

- CBWTP successful in developing a market
- Measurable progress towards restoring rivers
- Monitoring ensures compliance
- Integration with habitat restoration needed
- CBWTP is well administered by NFWF
- CBWTP has broader application
 - Complementary restoration activities
 - Water transactions in other western states

- Presentation of Results (NFWF & NPCC)





CBWTP Successful in Developing a Market

Steady Progress Towards Restoring Rivers






Monitoring Ensures Compliance

Recommendations

- Revise performance metrics
- Integrate with other restoration activities

- Explore land-water conservation deals
