SUBJECT: Update on the Anadromous Monitoring Strategy Workshop

The first session of the Columbia Basin Coordinated Anadromous Monitoring Strategy Workshop was on October 20 and 21, 2009 in Skamania, WA. In attendance were executive representative and lead representative from Bonneville, the Bureau of Reclamation, Columbia Basin Fish and Wildlife Authority, Colville Tribe, the Columbia River Intertribal Fish Commission, Idaho Fish & Game, Nez Perce Tribe, NOAA Fisheries, Council staff and one Council member, Oregon Fish & Wildlife, Shoshone-Bannock Tribe, the Army Corps of Engineers, the US Forest Service, US Fish & Wildlife Service, Umatilla Tribe, Warm Springs Tribe, Washington Fish &Wildlife, WA Governor's Salmon Recovery Office and Salmon Recovery Boards, WA Monitoring Forum, the Yakama Nation, and observers from ISRP, ISAB, and the Pacific Northwest Aquatic Monitoring Partnership. Most of these entities also had one or more resource representative present resulting in over 50 attendees (see Attachment 1).

During the October session, the workshop conveners provided an overview of the process todate, and each of the five sub-regional workshop groups presented a brief description of their salmonid monitoring strategy for viable salmonid parameters, habitat effectiveness, and hatchery effectiveness. The session ended with a discussion of how best to strategically achieve the workshop's goal by the end of the second session, including discussion of assignments for participants and conveners to complete prior to the next session.

The second session of the workshop is scheduled for November 3-5, 2009 at Skamania, WA. During this session, workgroup participants will finalize a framework for anadromous monitoring with a focus on viable salmonid population parameters, habitat effectiveness, and hatchery effectiveness. Participants will also work on an agreed upon strategy for implementing these three focal areas of the framework, which includes relevant Federal Columbia River Power System Biological Opinion monitoring and evaluation Reasonable and Prudent Alternatives (FCRPS BiOp RME RPA). An assessment of how current monitoring meets or could be adapted

503-222-5161 800-452-5161 Fax: 503-820-2370 to meet this strategy, as well as identifying and prioritizing gaps will be completed. For high priority gaps, especially FCRPS BiOp RME RPA gaps, a rough cost estimate of potential proposals for filling the gaps will be discussed.

We will have completed the 5 day workshop by the time of the Council meeting in November and will include comments about the second session at that time. We can also briefly discuss at that time related follow on processes.
