SUBJECT: Planning for the RTF Policy Advisory Committee Meetings

The Council approved creation of a Regional Technical Forum Policy Advisory Committee (RTF PAC). Its broad goal is to *Identify a business/governance structure for a sustainable entity that provides independent analyses of energy efficiency to meet the region's needs and develop a multi-year funding structure that supports that entity.*

The RTF PAC is an advisory committee to the Council, not to the RTF itself. The Charter describes four specific areas that the Council seeks guidance and advice on:

- The organization and operating procedures of the RTF;
- RTF work plan priorities and the policy implications of RTF technical recommendations and their implementation;
- The funding structure for the RTF, and long-term (5-year) funding commitments from the funding utilities and agencies; and
- RTF progress in accomplishing its objectives and completing its work plan consistent with the work plan priorities.

The RTF PAC has scheduled its first meeting for July 28, 2011. We are in the process of scheduling two follow-on meeting in September and October. I would like to go over with the Power Committee our thinking on the agenda for the first meeting, the questions we want to ask the RTF PAC to address, and topics for the follow-on meetings.
