SUBJECT: RTF 2013 WORK PLAN AND BUDGET: RECOMMENDATION OF THE

REGIONAL TECHNICAL FORUM POLICY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Regional Technical Forum Policy Advisory Committee (RTF PAC) has completed its review of the proposed RTF 2013 Draft Work Plan and Budget and recommends that the Council approve the 2013 Work Plan and Budget as submitted by the RTF.

The RTF PAC gave consideration to the shift away from consultant contracts in favor of using RTF contract employees for completion of some of the RTF's work. The PAC applauds the improved cost and efficiency of such an approach. At the same time, the PAC discussed whether this shift would potentially affect the independence of results by moving away from "third parties" and toward "in-house" staff. The PAC will monitor this issue and advise the Council at a later date on the ongoing independence of RTF findings.

The RTF Policy Advisory Committee appreciates the opportunity to offer this recommendation to the Council and respectfully requests approval.
