SUBJECT: Update on May 15th Regional Quagga and Zebra Mussel Summit

Due to the severe threat posed by the invasive quagga and zebra mussels to the waters of the Pacific Northwest, there is a compelling need to define and implement a region-wide prevention and response strategy. Recognizing this need, the Northwest Power and Conservation Council has partnered with The Pacific Northwest Economic Region (PNWER), Portland State University (PSU) and the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission (PSMFC) to jointly sponsor a regional workshop entitled:

Preventing an Invasion: Building a Regional Defense Against Quagga and Zebra Mussels

The purpose of the May 15, 2013, workshop in Vancouver, Washington, is to bring together private and public sector utilities, natural resource agencies, industries, tribes and environmental groups (e.g., water users and natural resource managers) all of which could be affected by these non-native freshwater mussels if they were to successfully colonize our waterways. Council staff has been working with staff at PNWER, PSU and PSMFC to develop an agenda, develop a mailing list of regional decision makers, prepare a letter of invitation, and meeting logistics.

The agenda (attached) will include speakers from water utility and power generation industries impacted by invasive mussels in the Lower Colorado River Basin and the Great Lakes, an overview of the potential ecologic and economic impacts to the Northwest, and comments from state and regional decision makers. We also plan to have four breakout sessions to provide attendees with the opportunity to learn more about the mussel threat and provide feedback on regional issues of importance such as: 1) rapid response and control options; 2) hydropower vulnerability assessments; 3) enhancing regional watercraft inspection efforts; and 4) developing a regional coordination mechanism for action and advocacy regarding funding and legislation needed to continue to protect the economic and ecological resources of the Pacific Northwest.
