BACKGROUND:

- Presenters: Tony Grover and Mark Walker
- Summary: Tony Grover and Mark Walker will report to the Council on discussions during their recent visit to various Congressional offices in Washington D.C. on December 2-3, 2014.
- Relevance: Periodic trips to Washington D.C. to discuss priority fish and wildlife issues with Congressional staff will assist in program implementation and our outreach efforts.
- Workplan: The Fish and Wildlife Division 2014 work plan calls for the Council to inform and involve stakeholders in regional fish and wildlife and energy issues. More specifically, it calls for us to implement a communications plan with key political leadership, including Congress and federal agencies, on trips to Washington D.C.
