The project is being conducted through significant in-kind contributions of the federal, state, and tribal salmon managers, and is cosponsored by the Pacific Northwest Aquatic Monitoring Partnership and StreamNet, with funding from Bonneville Power Administration and the

**Environmental Protection Agency.**
