BACKGROUND:

Presenter: Mark Rehley

Summary: A significant portion of the potential in the Seventh Power Plan was from new and emerging technologies. As we begin looking toward energy efficiency measure development for the Eight Power Plan, one of the places to begin is to investigate which new measures might be ready to include in the supply curves.
