DECISION MEMORANDUM

TO: Council Members

FROM: Mark Fritsch, project implementation manager

SUBJECT: Council decision on Third Quarter within-year project-funding requests

PROPOSED ACTION: Approve four of the within-year project-funding requests as defined and conditioned by staff.

BUDGETARY/ECONOMIC IMPACTS

The total requested amounts are \$137,912 expense and \$1,912,000 capital funds in Fiscal Year 2009, and \$121,694 expense funds in Fiscal Year 2010. These amounts are in addition to the Fiscal Year 2009 and 2010 funding recommendations.

BACKGROUND

The Bonneville Power Administration (Bonneville), the Council, and the Columbia Basin Fish and Wildlife Authority have formed a budget oversight group (BOG) to conduct a budgettracking process. A principle role of the BOG is to validate whether the requests are reschedules or within-year requests (i.e., scope change, budget change, scope/budget change, reschedule, and new request) and to place the within-year requests into one or more of the sorting categories (1-5). Reschedules are forwarded to Bonneville for assessment and funding as funds become available, and within-year requests are also forwarded to Bonneville for a recommendation on the availability of funds as identified at the quarterly reviews.

The BOG uses the quarterly reviews to initiate a prioritization process to establish which budget adjustment requests can be met with the available funding in the current fiscal year project budget. This process also includes a public comment period.

On July 14, 2009, the Council staff presented the requests and reviewed the schedule for the within-year budget adjustment requests for the Third Quarter of Fiscal Year 2009.

The comment period associated with these requests closed on July 27th. No comments were received.

ANALYSIS

Of the 5 requests reviewed by the BOG during the Third Quarter of Fiscal Year 2009, four requests will need a decision in August. One request was deferred by Bonneville for a draft recommendation until a later time. The following categories, as outlined in the attached table (see Attachment 1), address the four project requests and the Council staff's recommendations. In addition, on July 30, 2009, the Council received a letter from Bonneville summarizing these within-year requests being considered during the Third Quarter of Fiscal Year 2009 (see Attachment 2).

<u>Category 3b1: Threats to Project Integrity - (b) that jeopardize the performance of a discrete task</u> or objective; (1) adverse biological consequences to the project

• Project 1995-009-00, Lake Roosevelt Rainbow Trout Net Pens

The Lake Roosevelt Development Association (LRDA) is seeking \$29,000 in Fiscal Year 2010 expense funds to met their costs for fish food to met next years annual releases into Lake Roosevelt. This project is works in collaboration with Spokane Tribal Hatchery and the Sherman Creek Hatchery and rear 750,000 triploid rainbows annually. Due to a lost of a grant that has supplemented the food cost for the past several years (current total feed cost is approximately \$48,000) the LRDA is requesting an additional \$29,000 to meet their rearing needs.

This project is supported by volunteers that assisted in the rearing at the net pens (e.g., construction and feeding) to help reduce the cost of the operations. In Fiscal Year 2009 approximately \$104,000 in confirmed cost shares was recognized. The Fiscal Year 2010 budget has been established at \$147,680 that reflects the Fiscal Year 2009 budget plus a 2.5 percent inflation. The request has taken the Fiscal Year 2010 budget into account for the \$29,000 request.

<u>Staff Recommendation</u>: Based on Bonneville's support for this request, and the understanding that the request accounts for the 2010 budget the Council staff recommends that the Council support this request.

• Project 1989-035-00, Umatilla Hatchery Operations and Maintenance (O&M)

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) has requested \$92,694 to cover utility and fish feed - general hatchery maintenance costs. This proposal funds operation and maintenance of Umatilla Hatchery and fish transfers from the Umatilla, Cascade, Oxbow, Bonneville, and Little White hatcheries to acclimation facilities on the Umatilla River. The hatchery has been operating near the Fiscal Year 2007 budget level and costs associated with the operations of the hatchery are anticipated to exceed their implementation planning budget for Fiscal Year 2010.

The Fiscal Year 2010 budget has been established at \$990,831 that reflects the Fiscal Year 2009 budget plus a 2.5 percent inflation adjustment. The sponsor did not take into account the Fiscal Year 2010 inflation factor when making the within-year project-funding request. Based on this understanding the request has been adjusted to \$68,528 to reflect the project's needs in context to the Fiscal Year 2010 budget.

<u>Staff Recommendation</u>: Council staff concurs with Bonneville in supporting this request at \$68,528 for the project's needs in Fiscal Year 2010.

Category 4: Lost Opportunity

• Project 2007-318-00, *Knapp-Wham and Hanan Detwiler Irrigation Consolidation and Well Drilling*

The Cascadia Conservation District is requesting \$137,912 in Fiscal Year 2009 funds to complete work necessary to complete work so that the Hanan Detwiler ditch can be closed. Work remains to address landowner needs associated with the conversion to wells and/or for upgrading an existing diversion

The goal of this project is for the consolidation of the Knapp-Wham and Hanan Detwiler irrigation systems that will eliminate partial fish passage barriers associated with 2 surface water diversions, add instream habitat within the lower Entiat River, and enhance instream flows via water saved.

The additional funds requested will address costs to complete the work necessary work to complete conversion to wells and/or for upgrading an existing diversion, so that the Hanan Detwiler ditch can be closed. This budget adjustment is needed to cover the costs associated an underestimated cost associated with the needed upgrade to an existing irrigation diversion (i.e., for the Keystone Ranch).

<u>Staff Recommendation</u>: Bonneville supports the budget adjustment of \$137,912 for this request. The Council staff recommends that the Council also approve this request conditioned that there will be no additional cost increases provided for this project.

• Project 2009-017-00, TNC Willamette Wildlife Acquisitions

The Nature Conservancy (TNC) is seeking \$1,912,000 in Fiscal Year 2009 capital funds to acquire fee title interest in the 10.45 acre Watson Property, Lane County, Oregon; acquire a conservation easement interest with active management rights to 150 acres of the 160 acre Smith Property, Polk County, Oregon; and acquire a conservation easement interest with active management rights to the 319 acres of the 350 acre Gahr Property in Yamhill County, Oregon from willing sellers. The request also includes \$30,000 in Fiscal Year 2010 - 2012 expense funds for operations and maintenance cost associated with the acquisitions.¹ These expense funds were already addressed as part of the funding recommendation associated with the Wildlife Categorical Review.

<u>Staff Recommendation</u>: The Willamette subbasin remains an under-mitigated wildlife area in the Columbia River Basin. The Willamette subbasin plan places a high priority for wildlife mitigation on protection and restoration of threatened oak savanna, upland prairie, and wet meadow habitat for valley and foothill species. Bonneville indicates that sufficient Fiscal Year 2009 capital funds exist for these conservation easements and acquisitions. Based on this information, Council staff supports this capital request for a favorable Council recommendation

In accordance with the Budget Oversight Group (BOG) process, the BOG conducted the third quarter review of within-year budget and/or scope modification requests for Fiscal Year 09 [submissions reviewed by BOG in April, May, and June]. These requests were presented at the July Fish and Wildlife Committee Meeting, and a 14-day public comment period was opened. As a result of the BOG review, consideration of any comments, and Council recommendations, the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) has arrived at the following draft decisions.

Project Funding Requests

Category 3b1 Project Number: 1995-009-00 Project Name: Lake Roosevelt Rainbow Trout Net Pens Contractor: Lake Roosevelt Development Association BPA-COTR: Carlos Matthew BPA Manager: Peter Lofy Budget Year/Amount Requested: 2010 / \$29,000 Funding Type: Expense How does this project support a Biological Opinion? This project does not support a Bi-Op. Explanation of need: The Lake Roosevelt Rainbow Trout Net Pen project is requesting additional funding in order meet the rising cost of fish food as well as compensate for the

additional funding in order meet the rising cost of fish food as well as compensate for the funding no longer received through the ALEA Grant. The WA state ALEA Grant was used to purchase fish food and was discontinued. This project provides final, off-hatchery rearing, allowing BPA to reduce the cost of rearing fish to release size (if final rearing was completed onsite at Sherman Creek and Spokane Tribal hatcheries).

BPA draft recommendation:

BPA supports this request for additional funding to replace funding once received through the ALEA grant. BPA recognizes the importance of this project as it relates to the success of resident fish programs for Lake Roosevelt. BPA will consider this increase in budget planning for FY11 and beyond pending future decisions on continued implementation of the project. BPA expects that the sponsor will continue to seek cost share funds through the ALEA and other grant programs.

How does this project support a Biological Opinion? This project does not support a Bi-Op. **Explanation of need:** The Umatilla Hatchery Operations & Maintenance project is requesting additional funds beginning in FY2010 to operate and maintain the Umatilla Hatchery. This is a request to increase the base funding from FY10 onward. In FY 2008, the contract was increased approximately \$23,000 to cover the additional expense of reallocating production of 350,000 spring Chinook from Little White National Hatchery to the Umatilla Hatchery. This increase covered fish feed and electricity (pumped water). Since 2007, personnel costs, electrical rates, and feed costs have increased. In order to operate the program at the same level as 2007, the FY10 need is \$1,059,358, which is an increase of \$68,528 to the draft FY10 budget of \$990,830.

BPA draft recommendation:

BPA supports this request to increase the draft FY10 budget by \$68,528 in order to operate the hatchery at the current production levels. BPA will consider this increase in budget planning for FY11 and beyond pending future decisions on continued implementation of the project.

How does this project support a Biological Opinion? This project supports RPA 57.4 and 34 of 2008 FCRPS BiOp.
Explanation of need: The UPA Knapp-Wham Hanan Detwiler Irrigation Consolidation project is requesting additional funding to cover shortfalls in the original budget estimate for this project. The original budget estimate for this project was developed nearly 4 years ago for the 2006 Council solicitation. Prices for construction and materials have greatly increased since then.

Completion was also delayed due to a change in project: the original project called for the drilling of several wells. These wells did not produce the desired volume of water, so the Conservation District decided to upgrade a landowner's existing diversion to provide this volume. It took several months to complete design and environmental review for this activity.

(BPA and the Council were notified of this project change during the August 2008 BOG meeting. It was determined at that time that no approval was needed, since there was no change in project scope.)

BPA draft recommendation:

BPA supports this request. Additional funding will allow the primary project objective to increase flows in the Entiat River to be achieved. This is a one-time request for FY09.

Explanation of need: The TNC project is requesting additional funding in order to acquire two

Explanation of need: The TNC project is requesting additional funding in order to acquire two conservation easements and one property in fee in order to partially mitigate for the remaining wildlife losses associated with the FCRPS projects located in the Willamette Basin. These acquisitions will protect and enhance oak and prairie habitat, key habitats identified in the Willamette subbasin plan and in the Oregon Conservation Strategy, and substantially increase protection of key Fender's blue butterfly populations in the south and north recovery zones of the Willamette Valley. Specifically, TNC proposes to acquire fee title interest in the 10.45 acre Watson Property (Lane County, Oregon); acquire a conservation easement interest with active management rights to 150 acres of the 160 acre Smith Property (Polk County, Oregon); and acquire a conservation easement interest with active management rights to the 319 acres of the 350 acre Gahr Property (Yamhill County, Oregon).

BPA draft recommendation:

BPA supports this request. The proposed acquisitions are consistent with wildlife mitigation objectives in the Willamette and will protect an estimated 162 Habitat Units (HU). Actual HU's protected will likely to increase once a field HEP survey is completed, which will occur the summer after the easements are acquired. This is a one-time request for FY09.

Category 4 Project Number: 2009-017-00 Project Name: TNC Willamette Wildlife Acquisitions Contractor: The Nature Conservancy BPA-COTR: Dorie Welch BPA Manager: Paul Krueger Budget Year/Amount Requested: FY09, likely FY10 / \$13,846,000 Funding Type: Capital How does this project support a Biological Opinion?: This acquisition will help the Action Agencies work towards their habitat restoration goals under RPAs 7.1 (completion of 2 highpriority habitat restoration projects annually) and 7.4 (restoration of habitat at revetments) in the Willamette Project Biological Opinion. **Explanation of need:** The TNC project is requesting additional funding in order to acquire fee title to the 1285-acre Wildish tract that includes the confluence and the lower reaches, 6 miles in total, of the Middle and Coast Forks of the Willamette River. The aquatic habitat and the surrounding floodplain forests, upland prairie and oak habitats support up to 31 focal species including federally listed steelhead and Chinook salmon. The property is located in a priority area for aquatic and upland habitat restoration as identified in the Willamette Subbasin Plan and in the Corp of Engineer's Willamette Floodplain Restoration Study, for which BPA has been a cost-share partner. At this time, the HU estimate is not known. This project would also address limiting factors to listed Chinook and steelhead, as identified in the Willamette BiOp and Subbasin Plan.

BPA draft recommendation:

BPA is deferring a draft recommendation at this time; we believe the project represent a good opportunity for both wildlife mitigation for Willamette projects as well as important habitat work for listed species. A recommendation will be developed once there is more certainty regarding the minimum wildlife HU's that would be expected from this property and the expected timeframe for potential closing of the acquisition. This is a one-time request.

Summary

In summary, the total of expense funding requested in this letter is \$259,606 and \$1,912,000 for Capital. We believe these projects are consistent with priorities identified during previous Council provincial reviews and/or other BPA and Council discussions.
