DECISION MEMORANDUM

TO: Council members

FROM: Ben Kujala, Power Division Director; Jennifer Light, Regional Technical Forum Manager

SUBJECT: Appointment of Regional Technical Forum Policy Advisory Committee Co-Chair.

PROPOSED ACTION: Appoint of RTF PAC member to serve as Co-Chair of the RTF PAC.

SIGNIFICANCE: The Council appoints a Council member to chair the advisory committee each year. The RTF PAC charter also authorizes, but does not require, the Council appoint a member of the RTF PAC as a co-chair. Since its inception, the RTF PAC has always had co-chairs. Last month, Council Member Tim Baker was appointed as the PAC Co-Chair. Cory Scott of PacifiCorp has been recommended by the RTF PAC to serve as the committee member Co-Chair.

BUDGETARY/ECONOMIC IMPACTS

BACKGROUND

The RTF is an advisory committee to the Council formed out of a directive from Congress to develop and maintain a library of conservation measures with estimated energy savings, measures costs, and measure lifetime. The RTF also develops standard protocols for determining energy savings for more complex conservation

measures, provides guidance for estimating energy savings for custom programs and program level savings, and tracks progress towards regional conservation targets.

The RTF Policy Advisory Committee was created by the Council to advise the Council on RTF policy and governance issues. The RTF PAC engages stakeholders in identifying regional priorities for energy efficiency work and assists the Council and RTF in securing the resources necessary to perform technical work required by the region. The RTF PAC also reviews the RTF's progress on its annual work plan and provides comments and advice to the Council on the organization and operating procedures of the RTF. Over the next year, the RTF PAC will provide ongoing comments and advice to the Council with respect to the policy implications of RTF technical recommendations and their implementation, as well as how to best meet the mutual needs of RTF stakeholders.

ANALYSIS

Per the charter, the Council appoints up to two persons to chair the RTF PAC. One of the Co-Chairs must be a Council member. The appointments are for one year.

Last month, the Council appointed Council member Tim Baker to serve as a PAC Co-Chair replacing Henry Lorenzen.

RTF PAC member Jim West, Snohomish County PUD, has served as co-chair since 2011. Mr. West will remain on the committee but seeks to step back from his role as co-chair. Cory Scott of PacifiCorp agreed to serve as the RTF PAC Co-Chair at the RTF PAC meeting held on March 1, 2018. Council staff recommends the Council appoint Cory Scott as the RTF PAC Co-Chair.
