Background on “Post-2011”

- *Post-2011*: EE’s framework that began on October 1, 2011, which aligns with the implementation of BPA’s Regional Dialogue power sales contracts
- Prior *Post-2011 public process*: conducted from January 2009 to March 2011
 - The process entailed two phases:
 - Phase 1: created the [Policy Framework](#)
 - Phase 2: defined program details in the [Implementation Program](#)

Background on Post-2011

- *High Level Outcomes:*
 - BPA funds 75% of the programmatic target with customers delivering the other 25%
 - Moving to more of an *equity* model for funding efficiency, the Energy Efficiency Incentive (EEI) replaced the Conservation Rate Credit (CRC) and is allocated to customers on a Tier One Cost Allocator (TOCA) basis
 - Flexibility mechanisms allow movement of funds
 - No individual customer savings targets
 - BPA retains its backstop role

Overview of the Post-2011 “Review”

- *Review:* during the initial public process, BPA committed to considering improvements to the program after sufficient experience had been gained
- *Objective:* hold a public process to review and consider improvements to the BPA energy efficiency policy framework and associated implementation elements put in place on October 1, 2011

Scope and Process

- *Scope*: a scoping document containing 15 issues
- *Process*: issues will be covered by five workgroups, which will provide BPA recommendations
 - Regional meetings will be held periodically to allow a wider audience to engage
 - Council members/staff can participate in the workgroups and regional meetings
